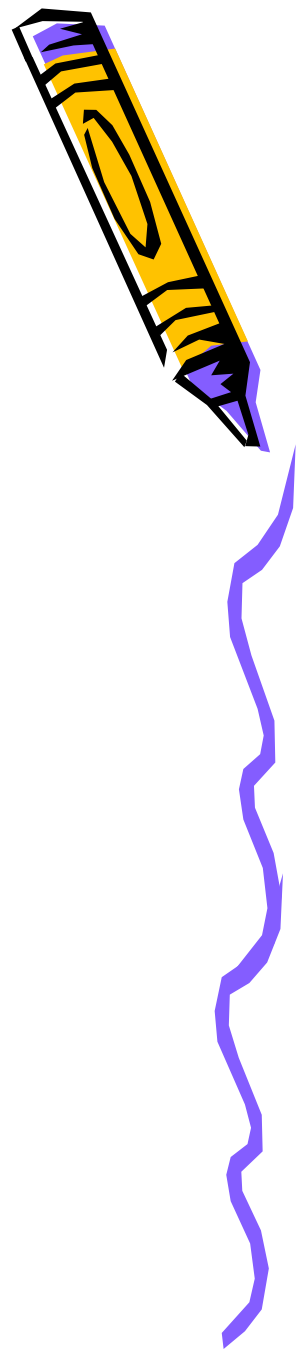

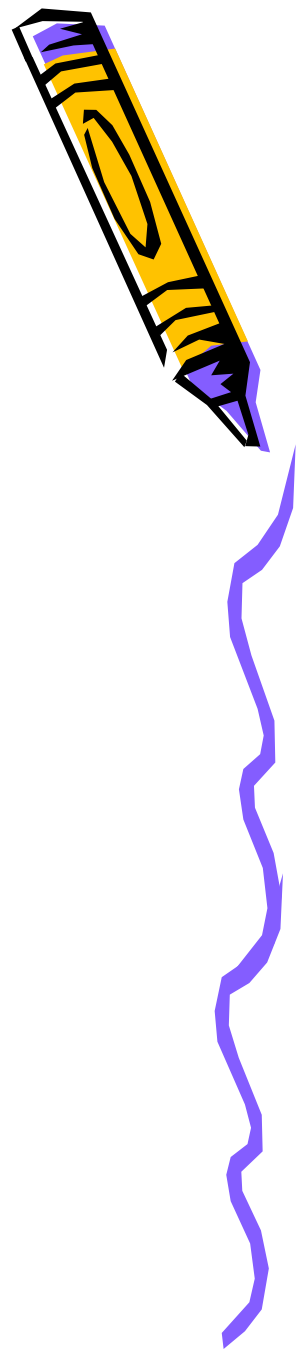
# Talk talk talk

- Children whom are immersed in language are more able to use it themselves in their writing



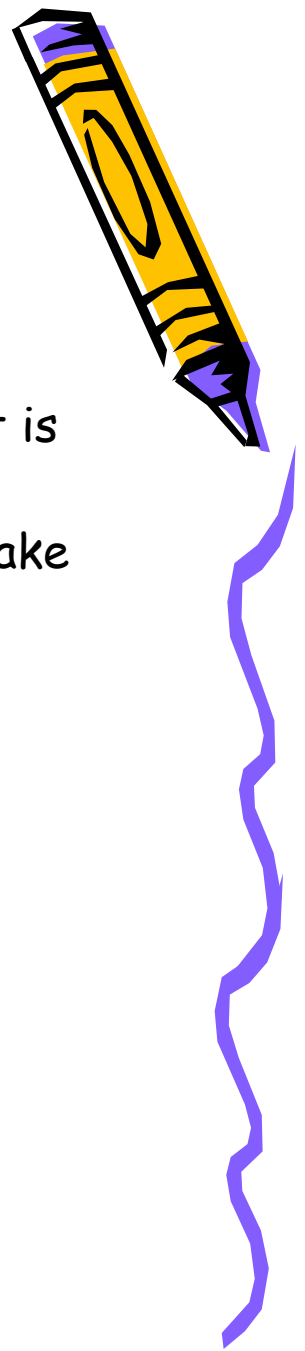
# Talk goes two ways

- It is a taking turns process.

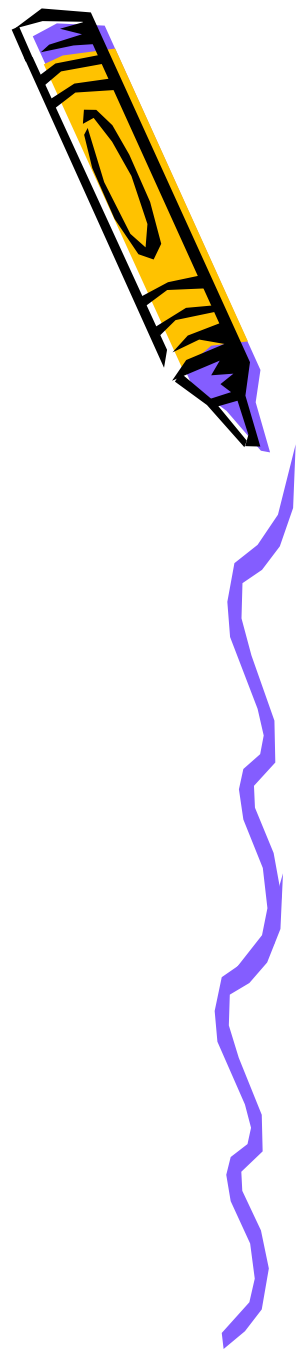


# Talking games
