## Choice of tasks for Home Learning

Your Home Learning task should reflect the time that you have been given to complete it. Please show us your best efforts, we will be showing these in class and displaying them in our school. These are only suggested home learning tasks, please feel free to speak to your class teacher about any other ideas that you may have!

Please keep the size of the projects to A3 size or smaller as we have limited space to display these in school and we would like to ensure all projects can be celebrated throughout the term on our home learning display.

l enjoy reading, writing and speaking	-Research some famous outlaws in history, such as Robin Hood or Dick Turpin. Create a fact-file about your favourite outlaw. -Write a mystery story based in a particular time period that we have learned about (Romans, Anglo-Saxons, Tudors, Victorians etc) and ensure there is a crime to be solved.
l enjoy working with numbers and being scientific	-Create a timeline of events through history about a specific aspect of Crime and Punishment, e.g. History of prisons or the court system. -Create a secret code using a cipher device.
l enjoy using creativity and art materials	-Research graffiti artists and create a graffiti masterpiece to support what you have researched. -Can you create a model of stocks and pillories that were used as a method of punishment?
l enjoy being active and doing hands-on activities	<ul> <li>-Create your own escape room with puzzles to solve or codes to crack.</li> <li>-Design/make your own prisoner clothing for a particular time period we are learning about.</li> </ul>
l enjoy working by myself	<ul> <li>-Create a news report (video or written) detailing information about a famous outlaw. Imagine that you are reporting during the times the outlaw was around.</li> <li>-Find out about the main events/developments in Crime and Punishment in the UK. Put the events into chronological order and create a timeline.</li> </ul>
l enjoy learning about the world around me	-Investigate an aspect of crime and punishment and how it differs around the world, you could display this information on or around a world map.

**<u>Resilience project</u>**: Build a 'trust walk' for a friend/family member. Your task is to lead a blindfolded partner through your created obstacle. Can you rely on their advise and support? Change the course and switch roles. How did you feel before, during and after completing the course?
