<u>Topic</u>

This topic will see the children experiment and investigate different forms of transportation. The children will focus their learning around the text 'The One Hundred Decker Bus'. They will create their own buses using a range of materials, make bus tickets during role-play and travel on a local bus. The children will then learn about trains in the past and present and how they compare. The children will make train journey maps and learn train related songs.

11-11.20 - Storytelling groups focusing on oral literacy skills, understanding of language and early reading and writing. 11.20-11.30 - Prepare for lunch and singing

11.30-12.30 - Children are supported to eat and play outside 12.30-1.15- Children work on skills in their personal, social and emotional development as well as their communication, expressive arts and design and understanding of the world. 1.15-2.30 - Child Initiated
