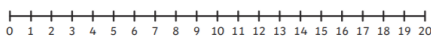
We are looking forward to some really exciting learning in Term 4!

Mathematics

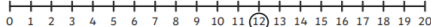
To start off our term, we will be looking at fractions. Then we will consolidate addition and subtraction. We will continue to practise times tables.
