You should:

- Click on the Survey Monkey link.
- Enter your votes into the survey (up to 2 candidates).
- Click 'vote' on the survey.
- Please note that the survey will close on Friday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2022 at 4pm..

If you would prefer to vote using a paper vote, please do pop into the school office where you will find some ballot papers, envelopes and a ballot box.

To vote via paper, you should:

- Mark an X alongside the two names you wish to vote for. **Do not** mark the ballot paper in any other way.
- Fold the ballot paper to preserve privacy of your vote and insert into an unmarked envelope.
- Insert the unmarked envelope containing the ballot paper into a second envelope, fill in your details on the front of the envelope as if addressing to yourself and seal it.
- Return your ballot paper to either Repton Manor or Greatstone Primary Schools by Friday 14<sup>th</sup> October 2022 at 4pm.
- NB. The use of 2 envelopes ensures that your vote remains confidential. Your details on the second envelope will be checked against the list of those entitled to vote. This envelope will then be removed so that your vote is anonymous.
