TAPESTRY Tapestry

Our Reception children have, for some time now, had an 'Online Learning Journey' within school. This is a secure online platform, used only by us in school, which documents their learning against their curriculum. Our Year 1 children have been trialling this, with great success, since last year. This term, we are starting a Tapestry Online Learning Journey for every child in our school. Our teachers, and our children themselves, will be collecting evidence of their learning from within their curriculum, across all subjects.

Last term we opened their children's Tapestry accounts to parents in Year R and the feedback so far has been very positive. Parents are able to login securely to their child's account and see their learning. Our aim is to gradually do the same for all children's parents in time. Our hope is that this will allow you all to see regular updates of your child's learning across all areas of their curriculum. I have been adding to our new 'Repton Photo Album' on our school website. This is a central place to share photos of recent events and I will update you as new collections are added.


Parental feedback has, in the past, been that families would like to be able to see as much as they can about what their children are doing in school and so we hope that this will help with

Clubs, Trips, Fundraising and Events Parent Survey




Thank you so much to everyone who completed our survey. We are very pleased with the number of responses that we received and we are pleased to be able to share the results with you below.




Trips and Visits


The majority of families feel we have the amount of trips and visits just right, but more than 40% feel we could offer more. The majority of families feel our trips and visits are fairly priced.






Residential Trips:

Feedback on trips and visits have raised the following:


- Several parents would like us to look at more frequent, local visits—comments suggested making better use of our locality.
- Families have asked to know what trips to expect, and estimated costs in advance.


What we are doing with your feedback?

We are going to make a 'Curriculum Enrichment' plan for each year group which will show all of the trips that we have planned, which are related to our Topics, for the entire school year. We will share this plan with families in September each year. We will include local trips in this plan and estimated costs. These may be subject to change, but will provide families with a rough idea of what to expect. Our Year 4 and Year 6 residential trips will continue each year and we will continue to look for best value.

Events and Workshops

The majority of families feel we have the right number of events and workshops, but approximately 35% feel we could offer more. The majority of families feel that what we do offer offers good value for money. Several comments mentioned wanting discos arranged for our children.







What we are doing with your feedback?

We will continue to plan special events and workshops into our Curriculum. We will add these to our 'Curriculum Enrichment Plan' so that families will know what to expect each year. We already have Valentines Disco's in the pipeline—watch this space!

Clubs

Most of our families would like to see more clubs offered by the school, even if they cost more because they are offered by outside providers.





Some of the clubs suggested are:

- Sports clubs Football, Tennis, gymnastics and dance, cycling.
- Lifeskills clubs cooking, sewing, first aid, survival, DIY
- Arts and Crafts clubs, Music and Drama clubs.
- Language clubs.
- Computing, Science clubs.


Several families also asked for the list of clubs and the sign-up time to be after school, so as not to disadvantage children of working parents.


What we are doing with your feedback?

We hope that you will notice that our clubs offer seems to increase each term. Our Phase Leaders, Miss Iles, Miss Kemp and Mr Jobber are looking to book more externally run clubs for you next term. If you have an ideas as to what you would like to see, please do mention this to them. We will also look at how we communicate and open-up the sign up sheets to families, to offer equality of access for all.

Fundraising:

The majority of families feel the school does enough fundraising for the school itself and also for charity. When asked which events families would like us to recognise, a large number said both Children In Need and Comic Relief. A great number of comments suggested celebrating / recognising more charities and national days of recognition but making donations optional.





What we are doing with your feedback?

We will continue to fundraise for the school itself and for charity, however, we will make donations for some of these fundraising events optional, and some will not involve fundraising at all but will instead offer a different mark of recognition (e.g. wearing a specific item of clothing and learning about the charity within school.
