### Reception

- We had a wonderful term two together, the children were so engaged in their learning about cultures and celebrations. It was wonderful to see the children develop their understanding and appreciate differences as well as celebrate similarities between different festivals. The children became very engaged in music, dance and drama related to these events. The children developed a larger repertoire of phonic sounds which they are able to apply more readily to reading and writing, we are so proud of the progress they have made in this area of learning! It's been wonderful to see relationships between children continue to develop and strengthen. The topic for term three will see the children experiment and investigate different forms of transportation. The children will focus their learning on the text 'The One Hundred Decker Bus'. They will create their own buses using a range of materials, make bus tickets during role-play and travel on a local bus. The children will then learn about trains in the past and present and how they compare. The children will then make train journey maps and learn train related songs. Lastly, they will become mesmerised by space and rockets as we read the text 'Blast Off' and go on a trip to space in our class rocket. We will find out about real astronauts and design and take part in astronaut training

- Can all children please ensure they are reading their sounds blending/ ditty booklets/ RWI/ AR books daily and this be recorded by parents in their reading record (yellow book). This consistency has a huge impact on their reading progress!

### Year 1

This term, we will be launching our new topic, Our Wonderful World by making our own Gingerbread men! We will be learning about the 7 continents of the World, looking in detail at each continent and thinking about what is the same or different in terms of animals, weather, plants, and landmarks. We will be learning about Christopher Columbus and find out all about his adventures while using our map skills. We will also learn about transport and look at the art work of Brian Pollard to help us create our own prints.

In English this term, the children will be learning the story of the Gingerbread Girl. We will be innovating the setting and characters and write an alternate ending to the story. We will also write instructions on how to make gingerbread men!

We will continue to develop our understanding of adjectives and nouns and use them in our writing to create a clearer picture in the reader's mind. We will continue to focus on punctuating our sentences correctly using capital letters and full stops, and will begin learning how to do so with question marks and exclamation marks too.

In Maths this term, we will continue securing our understanding of place value to 20 as well as our addition and subtraction learning involving larger numbers. We will develop a good understanding of how we can represent numbers above 10 in different ways and how we use our knowledge of number bonds to help us answer tricky calculations as well as reasoning and problem-solving questions. We will also begin learning about doubling and strategies to answer missing number problems.

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### Year 2

In Maths, we have been impressed with the children's enthusiasm to participate in Numbots at home and we have seen great progress. This term, we will continue to develop our addition and subtraction skills before moving onto learning about 2D and 3D shapes. We will learn to name, identify, classify and draw a range of shapes.

In Reading, the children will continue to be sent home with 2 RWI books to read. For the children who have completed the RWI programme, they will bring a home a book of their choice that is matched to their reading ability age. They will complete a quiz in school each time they have read their book before moving onto a new one. We would like children to complete 15-20 minutes of reading at home every day and for parents to then sign their reading records so we can keep track in school.

In Writing, we will be learning all about Samuel Pepys and writing our own diary entries to retell the Great Fire of London. We will experience a re-enactment of this event when we visit Kent Life for our school trip. We will be focusing on using a range of different sentence types with the correct punctuation and using apostrophes for possession and contractions.

As part of our topic, 'Times of Change,' we will be planning and creating our own fire truck models. If you have any egg boxes, carboard boxes, yoghurt pots and bottle tops, please can they be brought in after the Christmas holidays.

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### Year 3

- ❖ In Term 3, we will be continuing with our topic of Stone, Fire and Ice, moving on from the Stone Age to the Bronze and Iron Ages. We will be starting our topic with a visit from Maidstone Museum where they will share some more facts, artefacts and activities linked to The Stone Age. In Writing, we will focus on writing a set of instructions and a historical recount. Our grammar focus is still to add a range of sentence openers and subordinate clauses to our work. In Maths, we will be continuing with Multiplication and Division before moving on to Length and Perimeter. In Topic, we will be looking at rocks in Science and the historical and geographical changes from the Stone Age all the way up to the Iron Age. We are so excited to get started, Year 3 rocks!
