**Curriculum Theme:** Creativity & Collaboration

**Current Topic:** Battles that have Shaped our World

All core subject Home Learning activities will be set each Friday. Your child's spelling test will take place on Thursday. Home learning books will be collected on Thursday and returned to your child on Friday.

Reading	Writing (GPS)	Maths
Read with an adult every night for at least 20 minutes if you are a free reader.	Practice spellings every night. Write your spelling in a sentence. This will develop knowledge of word meaning and sentence structure.  Please see the spelling strategies sheet for more information.	Times Tables are the foundation to understanding and accuracy in solving a range of mathematical areas. Ensure that you practice your times tables regularly to improve your speed and accuracy of times tables recall.

Your child has been issued with a CGP book to help them to review key concepts in Reading, Maths and GPS. A weekly task will be set from each book, which can be supplemented with the current home learning challenges as listed above.

Please note that as part of preparing your child to be secondary ready, there will be consequences in place for children not completing their home learning to develop skills of accountability and personal organisation. As usual, if you or your child require support with their homework or would like to discuss any of the home learning expectations further, please do not hesitate to get in touch with your Class Teacher or Teaching Assistant.

**Project based Home Learning**

In school this term, children will be learning about our topic of 'Battles that have Shaped our World' (see our Term 5 newsletter or speak to the children for more information) Children may choose to answer any of these BIG QUESTIONS and to present their findings in they way they feel is best:

Ambition and Possibilities  "Mankind must put an end to war before war puts an end to mankind" – John F Kennedy.  Is humankind capable of eradicating war from our planet?	The Arts and Sports  What conflict was brewing in sport during our focused period from History?  From Test Cricket's The Ashes to Boxing's Rumble in the Jungle, examine the most intense rivalries in sporting history.
Enquiry  What was it like to live in London during WW2?  Try identifying online archive materials to explore this further.	Knowledge of the World  What roles did women play during both World Wars?  Try exploring the fascinating Woman's War photography of Lee Miller.
