Starting School - The Early Years

Who will be teaching and caring for my child in Year R?

Our dedicated team for the Early Years Foundation Stage, who are experienced in settling children into school life and supporting them to reach those early milestones, will be teaching the children in Year R.

How will my child get to know these key adults before they start school?

We will make Nursery visits in June/July. We will also have stay and play sessions for the children to get to know their classroom.

We will make Home Visits to all children during June and July. The purpose of a Home Visit is for staff to meet children in their own surroundings, where they feel happy and secure. Children really respond to their teachers coming to see them at home and it also gives parents the opportunity to ask questions and to talk about their child.

When will my child start school?

We want our children to make a smooth transition into school. Children need time and good quality adult support to settle and to feel secure. They will then get the best from their experiences. Your child's transition into school will happen through a carefully planned transition which initially allows the children to come into school for shorter sessions. This allows them to return to the familiar base of home more quickly than a typical day at school.





Starting School - The Early Years

Our Vision for Early Years

Upon starting the Early Years at Repton Manor, children will be invited into an enriched environment which enables them to make independent choices, develop interests, build resilience and ignite curiosity. Within this carefully thought about environment, adults have a deep understanding of how children learn and develop in the Early Years specifically. Adults spend time becoming engrossed in shared thinking and discussion, they know how to move learning on in a purposeful way. We ensure that every child's voice is heard and individual needs are met through rigorous plan, do, review cycles for individuals and groups. All areas of the EYFS curriculum are valued and significant importance is placed on developing the Prime areas. It is important to us that children are given real life experiences which they are able to draw upon using their skills and knowledge to build links between different areas of learning. You will find our children outside come rain or shine, experiencing the weather and the changing seasons. We see our Early Years children as endlessly capable individuals.

How will my child learn during the first year of school?

Children have planned, daily adult led learning opportunities as well as their own child initiated learning times. The routine develops over the year and changes to meet the children's needs as they grow and learn. We love spending time learning in our outdoor classroom as well as in our exciting indoor environment.
